New Social Enterprise Model Now Available

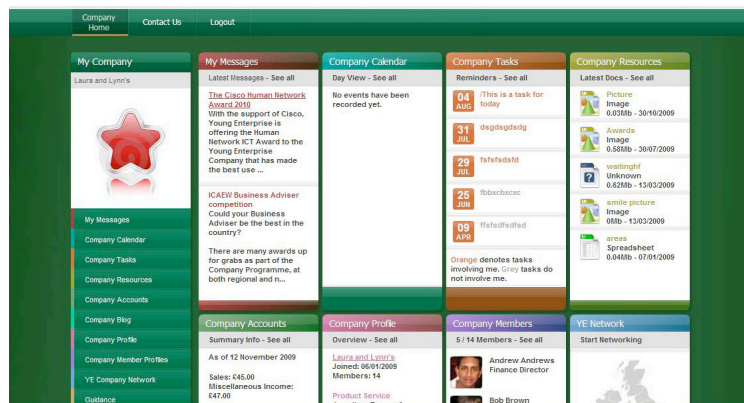

Start Something with Real Impact

A recent independent evaluation of Company Programme tracked down those who had taken part in the programme (Young Enterprise Alumni) and investigated the impact that the programme had had on their lives and careers. The evaluation found that our Alumni:

- Identify Young Enterprise as contributing to the development of their **employability skills and attitudes** more than any other experience
- Are **more passionate about their jobs** and satisfied with their career choices
- Are **twice as likely to start their own business** as their peers
- Are **more successful in their careers** regardless of social background
- Show increased **social responsibility**, being more likely to carry out volunteer work than their peers

Supporting qualifications

- Company Programme students can sit the OCR Young Enterprise Certificates in Enterprise at Level 1, Level 2 and now also available Level 3 (for more information see www.ocr.org.uk)
- In **England** the programme supports the project/extended project and a range of new diplomas including:
 - **Business Administration and Finance**
 - **IT**
 - **Retail**
 - **Manufacturing and Product Design**
- In **Scotland** students can sit the University of Strathclyde Business School examination and the programme contributes towards a number of qualifications including the Intermediate level 2 award in Enterprise and Employability
- In **Northern Ireland** the programme contributes towards a number of CCEA qualifications including the GCSE Learning for Work
- In **Wales** Company Programme supports a number of qualifications including the Welsh Baccalaureate
- The programme contributes to a range of ASDAN awards and qualifications including the Universities Award and CoPE
- Students can use their Company Programme experience to support the enrichment element of the AQA Baccalaureate

Supporting university entrance

Company Programme is widely recognised by universities when included as part of the personal statement section of a UCAS application. The programme can be used to support a range of level 3 qualifications which carry UCAS points including Business Studies, Applied Business Studies and Economics.
