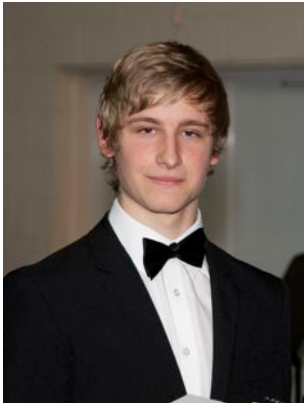

We would like to congratulate our pupils, staff, and parents for yet another year of examination success. St John's College is celebrating being top school for A-level results in Wales for the 14th successive year, and in November 2013 the college was listed again as the top performing school in Wales in *The Sunday Times* "Parent Power". This year's university applications have very strong representation across all our A-level subjects, as well as medicine, dentistry, veterinary science, law, law in combination with European languages, business, history of art, management, accounting and finance, engineering, and natural sciences.

The College has strengthened its commitment to success and participation in sport by expansion of the Physical Education team, with new and additional talent; Particular recent highlights include the gymnastics team's successes at The Welsh Schools Floor and Vault Championships, and the Tennis team's victories at the UK Tennis Championships. The School's extracurricular activities continue to flourish, and in recent months, members of the School's Engineering Club were among winners of the Engineering Team Challenge, organised by the Institution of Civil Engineering, and our pupils were awarded 'Best Engineered Car' at the Formula 1 Regional Finals in Swansea earlier this year. The College has come to public attention for its remarkably successful Maths Challenges, and the History department's high achieving Debating Society which won prizes at the ESU Public Speaking Competition, and represented Wales in UK finals. Our R13 Team was victorious in the Intermediate Rotary Competition, our R16 team won the Senior Rotary Youth Speaks Competition, and our Sixth Form Debating Team won the Cambridge Union Debating Competition. 2013 - 14 has also been yet another magnificent year of music making at St John's College. The choristers have sung and appeared in a major Hollywood feature film, and the Concert Orchestra has been broadcast on S4C in recent months. In the last fortnight, the choir performed a major sequence from Monteverdi's Vespers at St David's Hall with a period ensemble from the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama, and following last year's two live national and international broadcasts, with the BBC National Orchestra of Wales at St David's Hall on BBC Radio 3, and *Sunday Worship* on BBC Radio 4, the choir has in the last fortnight been broadcast again live on Radio 4 before an audience of 1.8 million. Following on from the success of last summer's Gilbert and Sullivan's *Trial by Jury*, rehearsals are already underway for performances of G & S *HMS Pinafore* on 9 and 10 July.
